Fifty years ago this country in which we live was split into two rival camps. The issues that pressed for solution had become irrepressible. There could be but one settlement, and that was by appeal to the court

of arms.

The appeal was taken, in the form of one of the bloodlest, most violent and protracted wars in history. It would have been natural to assume that the acrimony engendered by this clash would have lasted indefinitely, at least for several centuries

#### A MAN WITH AN IDEA.

When Mr. Eakes took charge there was not one mile of improved highways. He won out. He gradually improved and extended the road system, until today the country has 300 miles of improved highways. 




