



## Mrs. Rae Frank, Mother of Prisoner, Denounces Solicitor Hugh Dorsey

Mrs. Rae Frank, the mother of the prisoner, startled the courtoom short. Iy before 4 o'clock, when she denounced Solicitor Dorsey when he made an at-tack on the character of her son J. Ashley Jones, a local insurance sgent, was in the witness chair test fying to the moral character of the ac-cused when the incleden tocetured. ### THE VOTE WAS 115 TO 46.

Washington, August 13 — President Wilson issued a statement before the democratic house caucus resumed con sideration of the administration cur sideration of the administration cur rency bill today announcing that he believed it not advisable to amend the measure at present with provisions for rural credits but to postpone the shape of banking reform until the De cember session when the government commission now studying the subject in Europe will have reported Representative A Mitcheil Palmer, chairman of the Gaucus, conferred with the president and was acquainted with the contents of the statement through which it was hoped to persuade so called insurgent democrats to abandon their fight for agricultural currency **Fresident Wilson's Statement**.

The president said 'Again and sgain during the discus sion of the currency bill it has been urged that special provisions should be made in it for the facilitation of such credits as the farmers of the country most stand in need of—agri Cultural credit as distinguished from ordinary commercial and industrial ordinary commercial and industrial credits Such proposals were not adouted

Such proposals were not adopted because such credits could only be im perfectly provided for in such a meas ure. The scope and character of the bill its immediate and chief purpose could not be made to reach as far as the special interests of the farmers requirement.
