Washington. May 16.—Democratic leaders in the senate were indersed late today in their determination to refer the Underwood tariff bill to the refer the Underwood tarm on the Consideration without public hearings. The Penrose-LaFollette amendment directing that public hearings be held was defeated LaFollette amendment directing that public hearings he held was defeated by a vote of 41 to 36, and the motion of Senator Simmons to refer the bill was then passed without a roll call.

Two democrats, Senators Hansdell and Thornton, of Louisians, voted for the republican amendment. Senator Poindexter, of Washington, progressive, voted with the majority. Senator Jones, of Washington, republican, who previously had determined to vote against public hearings, announced that he had changed his mind heartist the finance subcommittees were giving brivate hearings to some interests which he thought should be public.

James Defends Witson.

The closing day of debates on the issue of hearings was enlivened with discussion of the democratic platform and its hearing on free sugar by Senator James, of Kentucky, who vigorously defended the stand taken by President Wilson for free sugar, declared that the party had stood for free sugar and campaigned on it, and defied the Louisians senators to find a man President Wilson ever had told he was opposed to free sugar.

Noose Found Knotted Around Neck of Mary Phagan Being Carefully Examined by Officers.

BURNS RIGHT-HAND MAN NOW PROBING MYSTERY

Fund Started by The Constitution for Purpose of Bringing Noted Detective to Atlanta Has Reached \$1,500.

the throat of Mary Phagan's lifeless body, Solicitor Dorsey and headquar-ters detectives aver they possess a valuable clue to the girl's murderer.

It is being inspected by experts, who also are examining specimens of cord picked up here and there in the facfory building in which the child was slain. Expecting to find a knot which compares with that which was used to strangle the victim, detectives are scouring every portion of the plant's premises.

President Wilson has wrought a public service by treading hard upon the toes of one of the cruelest and most dangerous elements in this nation-the slayers by proxy, the jingoes who, recklessly and without conscience, seek habitually to involve the country in trouble by which neither their property nor their own precious necks, would be imperiled. He has issued instructions that while diplomatic negotiations are proceeding between this nation and Japan neither army nor navy shall en gage in maneuvers that might he even re-motely construed as hostile to the latter empire. Heretofore sallow-hued and hysterical journalistic jingoes, and near-statesmen of the same type, have seized upon the slightest routine military activity as a pretext for premature and farcical "declarations of war" and criminal distortions of fact so worded as to appeal to the most unlovely passions of the public mind. Hereafter at least one source of material will be closed to their wanton and de structive instincts.

We are in a fair way to settle amicably our differences with Japan. If war is or ever has been threatened it is due chiefly to irresponsible and incendiary agencies in America, abetted by flannel-mouthed and dense demagogy in California. People who do their own thinking instead of accepting the predigested sort know how desperate is the financial situation of Japan. Her "elder statesmen" realize that whatever might be the temporary advantage of the mikado's navy the result of a war with the United States would place the future of Japan hopelessly in pawn; would enjoin her development for heaven alone knows how many decades. So that even if Japan were disposed to fight, which emphatically she is not, the most rudimentary self-preservation would hold her in check

Have they thought upon the stupendous pension roll, under which this nation already is groaning, and which bars so many other imperative improvements-a pension roll that another war must inevitably and largely increase? Have they dreamed of the havoc they would work upon business, the setback they would

William J. Burns, the world's greatest detective, should be able to solve the Mary Phagan case, the greatest criminal mystery and the most revolting crime in the history of Atlanta. Public interest, keyed as it has not been in many years, at least feels that supreme appeal should be taken to Mr. Burns in a final effort to fix blame and insure punishment. 





Bristow, who had been for two years secretary of the treasury in President Grant's second administration, retired from office so that he might accept profitable openings for the practice of law which had come to him un solicited from certain wealthy interests in New York city. General Bristow, who gained not only so

large a professional practice that he was un able to take more than an occasional part in social or public occasions, was nevertheless so popular that he usually held quite a

his tuncheon within the hour which he gave to himself. Men stood around his table chat-ting with him; he almost always had two or three companions at the luncheon table. He was a conspicuous personality, and was frequently pointed out to strangers who had been invited to take luncheon with members as the man was narrowly missed the presi-

dential nomination at the republican na-tional convention of 1876. General Bristow was a man of fine per-sonal appearance. He was of a sturdy frame; his head was of superb proportions and rested naturally and easily upon his shoul-ders. He was erect either sitting or stand-ing, and his step was like that of a trained soldier, a much more military step than was that of General Sherman, who frequently

I was taking luncheon at this club one day with William R. Grace, who was twice mayor of New York, and who organized the greatest mercantile lines of steam between the United States and South America in the early nineties.

"I never take luncheon at this club," said Mayor Grace, "without being impressed with the attention which is paid to General Bristow. Just look now at the table yonder at which he is sitting. There are two or three men who stand talking with him, and their manner betrays their respect and admira-

The World's Mysteries



WHERE IS ROBERT EMMET BURIED?

Robert Emmet is Ireland's greatest patriot. He expresses to the Irish everything that is good and noble, and to them his name will live as long as history because of his efforts in behalf of their country. The most unfortunate part of it all is that his nation knows not today where "rosts his head upon the lap of earth." If they knew, what a great memorial they would erect to his memory, and with what reverence

would this resting place be guarded.

It is considerably more than a century since Emmet was put to death, and since that time historiane, patriots and many others have tried to find the place where his body lies. According to D. J. O'Doneg-hue, "the body was claimed by Dr. Gamble and interred with great secrecy in Dublin; but where, has always remained, and will

probably continue to remain, a mystery."

Emmet's brother-in-law believed the body was buried in St. Michan's church, and he said he had held a conversation with the man who interred it there and who said a large uninscribed stone was erected over the grave. But there is no entry to that effect in the church register. There have been several other suggestions as to the place of burial. One historian says Emmet was buried in the Protestant churchyard of Glasnevin; and another, a relative, asserts the remains were placed in the family vault in St. Peter's. The Klimainham jailer, where the patriot was put to death, reported that Emmet was buried in "Bully's Acre," where paupers and hanged oriminals were usually laid. His friend, Dr. Gamble, is said to have exhumed the body from there and to have carried it to some unknown spot, but where it was removed to," writes Dr. R. R.

It seems almost incredible that the body of the frish tational hero could have been so mysteriously spirited away, at a period as late as his death, September 20, 1803, with no clew having been left as to where and by whom,

It was the revolution of July, 1893, in which Emmet engaged that brought his life which Emmet engaged that brought his life to such an unhappy end. Born in Dublin, on March 4. 1778, of an excellent family, from boyhood he showed every promise of a brilliant future. While still at college he became enthusiastic over the "United Irishmen" movement and an earnest worker for his oppressed country's freedom. For this reason he was expelled from college and he spent two years on the continuous.

Returning home secretly he entered heart and soul into the plan for a general Irieli revolution. On July 23, 1803, he and his colleagues attempted to seize the arse and and castle of Dublin. When this revo-lution failed Emmet was compelled to fine to the Wicklow mountains, where he bided his time until he could cross safely to France. France.

Finally the opportunity offered, but his love was too strong to allow him to go with-out a farewell visit to his sweetheart. Sarah Curran. He knew the danger of an appearance in Dublin, but he took the chance. His arrest came the moment he reached the city. He was tried for his life on a charge of high treason against the British govern-ment and was condemned to die. His fiery ment and was condemned to die. His flery speech at the court when asked if he knew of any reason why sentence should not be passed upon him is familiar to every school boy, and closed with the following dramatic

lines:

"I have but one request to ask at my departure from this world; it is the charity of its silence. Let no man write my epitaph; for, as no one who knows my motives dares now vindicate them, let not prejudice or ignorance asperse them. Let them and me repose in obscurity and peace and my tomb remain uninscribed until other times and other men can do justice to my character.

"it's too bad to see great men die with bob-o-links in their cupolas," said the low-browed man, sympathetically, "but the surprising thing is that poets ever retain pos-session of their faculties. They have a great deal to contend with. 'I used to live at the same boarding house with a poet, and that man had more varieties of trouble than you could keep cases on with an adding machine. He had the room right across the hall from mine, and he was always biting pieces out of the furniture. vance of 2 points on May, but generally unchanged to 2 points lower, and soon sold 5 to 6 points under the closing figures of last night on active po-
