# Faith in Atlanta Erected Building; Joel Hurt Had It

BY WINFIELD W. DUDLEY.

Faith in Atlanta has erected the Hurt building.

Seventeen stories of steel and stone, divided into magnificent offices, will be opened October 1 as the business home of thousands whose southern business activities radiate from Atlanta.

Upon Joel Hurt's faith in Atlanta rose the Equitable building in 1892. It brought to Atlanta the representatives of huge business interests who previously had located in other cities because proper housing could not be found here. The Equitable building proved the necessity of modern offices and other buildings arose, until today travelers remark, "Atlanta has more skyscrapers than any other American city twice its size."

Office buildings in Atlanta are occupied rapidly, and business interest throughout the south, and in many instances throughout the world, are directed from them. In New York, while a group of men were being told about the rising Hurt building, one gentleman expressed the opinion that Atlanta could not support such a venture. He declared it his belief that cold arteady overloaded with offices space. Joel Hurt heard of the remark, telegraphed to Atlanta to have the offices here counted and the vacant onesenumerated. Out of three thousand offices counted only nine were found vacant, and they were not in modern buildings.

One-third the space in the Hurt building has been leased before completion. It is estimated that by January 1 the building will be occupied fully, the tenants coming from outside Atlanta to carry on business in this territory. This is being recognized more and more as the best place from which to conduct southern business, and many business enterprises are planning to move, not only branch houses here, but their general headquarters as well.

Thus it is neither the purpose nor the necessity of the Hurt building to draw tenants from other buildings. Office buildings promote the growth of any city. Atlanta is the most striking exposition of that truth. Mr. Hurt states the proposition that "office buildings do more than any other agency, with the possible exception of the railroads, to advance commercial growth." I believe Mr. Hurt is right, even applying his statement to cities at large, but Atlanta, without question, establishes the force of his argument.

The Hurt building, which Mr. Hurt affectionately calls "a house," has been discussed and allegance for ten years. The foundations were hid as

The foundations were laid at the earliest moment that business conditions seemed to warrant the investment. The property on which the Hurt building rests is in the original center of the city. It is customary to regard the center of Atlanta as some distance west, since the trend of building has been in that direction. Years ago the city's growth to the eastward was restricted by a solid half-mile of private property and buildings without a public street. Half a mile east of where the Hurt building now stands was the west end of a narrow lane running of the terminus of the Georgia railroad.

He acquired the solid half-mile of property, on which were standing improvements worth \$100,000. Edgewood avenue was cut through, and the city presented with the street. The lane to the railroad was widened, and a city street two miles long laid out.





Instead of a narrow flat-iron apex, with a mere slit of a window, shutting off instead of letting in air and sunshine, the apex of the Hurt Building presents to the western sun a broad front forty feet wide, two hundred and fifty feet high, with a row of full-sized windows across the entire front of each floor.

EVERY CONVENIENCE.

The entrance will be equipped with every convenience for targets.

The entrance will be equipped with every convenience for tenants. It is roomy, light and airy. To the left of the entrance will be a battery of express elevators, and locals to the right. These cars will be for the use of passengers only, freight being delivered through a sidewalk elevator on Exchange Place to the basement. Here modern freight elevators will take the freight and carry it to the floors above. Tenants or their visitors always will be free from annoyance by freight shipments and receipts.

Rising to the floors above, one looks in vain for the customary dark core.

Rising to the floors above, one looks in vain for the customary dark corridors found in office buildings. Every room in the Hurt Building is flooded with light and air, both having a free sweep from outside windows into every office and hallway. Transoms over the doors and close-fitting, easily operated windows provide perfect ventilation, while the rooms are kept at an even temperature by a thermostatic heat regulation system that the occupant sets to suit his own convenience. pant sets to suit his own convenience.

Corridor floors are of Alabama marble and all office floors are of White-Corridor Hoors are of Alabama marble and all office floors are of White-stone Marble Terraza, which is marble chips mixed in cement and laid on a concrete cinder base over tile. Floors of this character, there being abso-lutely no other kind in the building, are a guarantee that mice, vermin or germs cannot subsist. In wooden floors the cracks harbor dirt and from be-hind elevators emerge mice which have eaten through the floors and made their mests underneath. No mice can live in the Hurt Building, and all floors can be thoroughly sterilized each night by the force of janitors main-rained.
