



To outlaw the annual "city cotton crop" and to standardize the cotton bale are the twin objects of several bills now being considered by the house committee on interstate commerce. One by Representative Adamson, of Georgia, has an accellent prospect of being enacted into law. Pew person outside of farmers and cotton traders have any conception of the amount of the staple very lost to the producer by means of the promiscous and unmethodical process of "sampling" that has long been in rogue. Buyers dg samples out of bales right and left, and never trouble to return them. The "sweepings" from this source are estimated at 20,000 bales annually. A law that would compel uniformity in sampling would check this undestrable form of piracy.

The disreputable balling of the American ortion crop has long been a source of compensation of the control of th

plaint abroad and of loss at home. Only recently has there been any systematic of- fort to enforce a standard and that originated with the railways. If the government makes cotton inadmissible to interstate commerce unless it complies with uniform regulations as to size and density of fulle it will save the producer two or three unliftens annually, and remove a distinct peril now meanting the supremary of American cotton in Europe.
