

Using Government Lands.

From the Department of the Interior, comes the interesting information that fifteen thousand permits for special uses of the Government's forest lands are now in force, ranging all the way from aplaries and cranberry marshes to fox ranches and whaling stations. Permits are limited, of course, to responsible persons and to industries that will in no way conflict with the Government's plan of con serving natural resources. The forest reservations are opened to individual enterprises without being posed to damage or serious encroachment.

This simple incident typifies the more liberal expo

and practical policy of conservation the Government is now pursuing. Time was when the main idea of conservationists was to place all public lands under a federal lock and key and hold them there. That point of view was largely justified by the fact that special interests were seeking to gain a monopoly of such resources; it was essential first of all to check these raids and to protect he common rights-But that phase of conservation has served its purpose. The great need of the present is to utilize and develop the vast field of natural treasure which the Government controls, to safeguard it still against monopolistic invasion, but at the same time against monopolistic invasion, but at the same time to open the way, as far as feasible, for honest enterprise






