



# **ECONOMY**—To the Voters of Fulton County:

In my announcement for the position of County Commissioner, made some time since, I stated my belief that by proper use of modern methods in equipment and work there need he no cessation of paving work at any time during the year.

I reaffirm that statement at this time, and pledge the people of this county my word that if I am elected County Commissioner I shall see that there is such a reorganization of the equipment of the public works department as will secure greater efficiency and guarantee more work in grading, and at the same time keep the paving squads at work all the year round and increase the number of miles of paved roads annually completed at least 20 per cent.

I believe the tax rate can be reduced without injury to the public improvements of the county, and shall advocate such reduction. I believe in being progressive, and at the same time economical.

#### For the Sake of Human Lives

HE all important purpose of the Grady hospital bond issue is the relief of human suffering, the care of human health, the saving of human

Is there a citizen in Atlanta who would turn in Is there a citizen in Atlanta who would, turn indifferently from the cry of a child in pain, or refuse
to answer a woman's call for help, or let a follow man
die for lack of timely sid? The appeal of Grady
bospital is an appeal in behalf of hundreds of men
and women and children in distress—a cry to the
heart and conscience of this community. A vote
for the head issue will be a work for humality. for the bond issue will be a vote for humanity; a vote against the bond issue will be a denial of piteous

On the night of April the sixth there were two hundred and seventeen patients in the beds at Grady hospital. The normal capacity of the institution is for only one hundred and eighty-six patients. Every day of the year all the wards are crowded, and it frequently happens that scores of sufferers must be ed away, simply because there is not as able foot of room. This is one reason why a bond ue for the enlargement of the hospital is required

The emergency operating rooms of the hospital now taxed beyond their capacity. This means that persons in a desperate condition cannot receive the attention they need. It means that lives which might be saved will be lost, unless the city provides more adequate facilities. That is another reason why the bond issue is required.

The bostial now cares for an average of two hundred bed patients a day with a nursing force of fewer than forty for the entire four-and-twenty hours. These nurses work faithfully, heroically, but it is impossible for them to serve the needs of so many patients. It should be noted, moreover, that the hospital has no living quarters for its nurses They are stored away in odd corners, with none of the conveniences or conforts to which their self-sacrificing labor entitles them. If the hospital is to meet its responsibilities, it must have more nurses, and a nurses' dormitory—another reason why the bond issue is imperative.

The urgent needs of the institution may be summarized as follows:

For outdoor clinic facilities, laboratory fa-cilities and emergency operating rooms—\$190,000. For a nurses' dormitory—\$75,000.

For wards for contagious diseases \$50,0 For additional wards for white patient -\$50,000

\$125,000

For wards for colored patients \$125,000. For maternity wards \$50,000. For pay wards (the only source of revenue)

For equipment and machinery such as a laundry, kitchen, refrigerator and boiler rooms

-\$50,000

-850,000.

And for the purchase of the remainder of the hospital block to secure needed space-\$25,000. The total supenditure involved is \$750,000, serry penny of which will count for the assuagement of pain, the cure of disease, and the protection of the community's most vital interests. With the exception of the community's most vital interests. of the one item for pay wards, every dollar of the fund will go to the aid of people who need hospital attention but who have no money to buy it. The main purpose of the pay wards is to extend the service of the free wards and to relieve the city of additional burdens in carrying forward the enlarge ment plans. It is conservatively estimated that the revenue from patients who will be able and willing to pay for such service as they can secure in a greater Grady hospital will ultimately be sufficient to cover the cost of all the improvements. Thus to cover the cost of all the improvements. Thus the bond issue will be a public investment, rather than a liability.

#### Georgia's Vital Interest

#### In the Drainage Congress.

es enlist so broad a variety of interests as does the National Drainage Congress, which meets this week at Savannah. It appears with equal force to the scientist and the busine man, the physician and the farmer, the engine and the investor, the government official who i studying the needs of the common country, and the individual citizen who is seeking to advance the welfare of his particular community. All parts of the Union, and especially the South, are concerned in the work the Drainage Congress has undertaken. The Savannah meeting will be attended by representatives of many different industries and many States, by Congressmen, Senators and other officials from Georgia itself.

The purpose of the National Drainage Congress
is to bring about the reclamation of these wast tract
of swamp and wet lands which are now a hindrane to progress and a menace to health, but which can be transformed into sources of wonderful oppor-tunity and development. It is estimated that there are some seventy-five million such acres in the United States, an area more than twice as great as United States, an area more than twice as great as that on which the South produces a billion dollar cotton crop each year. Fifty million acres, or about two-thirds of this land, ite in the Southern States; and two million, seven hundred thousand acres of swamp and overflow land are in Georgia. That amounts to one-fourteenth of Georgia's entire area, and exceeds more than a third of the area of Holland, a country which supports a population twice s great as Georgia's.

It is thus evident that the South has pe

reason to be interested in drainage enterprises, and that deorgia is vitally concerned. In discussing the importance of the approaching Drainage Congress, Mr. Richard H. Edmonds says that the fifty million acres of wet land in the South is now worth not more than ten dollars an acre, or in the aggregate not more than five hundred million dollars; but, if drained at a cost of ten to twenty dollars an acre, this land would be worth from seventy-five to s hundred dollars an acre, "and would yield annually probably fifty dollars or more per acre, whether in corn, cotton or other crops." Thus its value would be increased from five hundred million to five billion dollars, or more. "Some time ago," says the same writer, "an English banker, who had just returned from Egypt where his firm was heavily in terested, told me that he had been buying cotton land in Egypt and paying from three hundred to four hun-dred dollars an acre for it. He did not think the price unduly high. And yet this Egyptian land is not equal to what a very large part of what the mil lions of acres of wet land in the South will be when drained.

The economic benefits that would accrue to Good gia from the reclamation of its swamp and over-flow lands have been strikingly set forth by Mr. S. W. Mcallie, the State geologist.

"It is well known," he says, swamp and overflow lands are, as a rule, re-markably fertile, and when properly drained and cultivated yield luxuriant crops. Lands of this character in Georgia, where favorably located, should bring at a low estimate, fifty dol-lars or more per scre, or fifty times their present assessed valuation, as shown by the tax returns. In case these lands were drained, the State, instead of receiving, as it now does, an

annual income in taxes to the amount of \$18,500

In 1870 the death rate from malaria in those States was fifty-two and two-tenths per thousand; that was before they had given any serious attention to drainage. In 1890, after thousands of acres of swamp land had been reclaimed, the death rate from malaria in the same States was only eight and six-tenths per thousand. These figures become still more impressive when compared with records from the east coast lands of Georgie, South Carolina and Florida. In these regions, the death rate from malaria was sixty-six and two tenths per thousand in 1870 and sixty-one and seven-tenths per thousand in 1890. The fact that the group of western States almost eradicated the disease within twenty years, while a group of South eastern States made such scant progress in that direction is due mainly to the adoption of drainage methods in the one case and the neglect of them in

and all the South a great opportunity to upbuild and conserve their material interests. This organ-ization represents potent influences and far-reaching purposes. At the Savannah meeting it will consider especially a plan to secure liberal aid from the fed eral government in reclaiming swamp lands. No part of the country is so largely concerned in that meyement as is the South, and none will profit so directly from its success. It is to be hoped, therefore, that Georgia and her neighbor States will be well represented at the Congress, and that they will join earnestly in the work the Congress seeks to do.






