With the Mexican people themselves, we have no quarrel, and thus far we are at peace with the Constitutionalists. Our armed forces are directed, for present at least, solely against the desperate ad venturer who styles himself provisional presiden of Mexico, and against his regime. Our one object In the seigure of Vers Cruz was reprised for insulta and wrongs to the nation's honor. It is evide however, that Huerta has no intention of apologizing or of vielding until he is driven to the last inch. He is determined to play out his losing game and to draw upon himself the full measure of our Govern ment's compulsion.

In these circumstances, it seems almost inevitable that American forces shall be sent to Mexico City. If that is the only course by which Huerta can be brought to terms, it will certainly be adopted. Government is evidently preparing for such an extremity, reluctant though it may be to go that far. The Administration has not been taken unawares by the present crisis. The admirable efficiency with which the navy and the army have moved shows that plans for action were carefully made in ade, and we may be sure that the President's polby takes due account of future emergencie

Much depends upon the final attitude of the Cor stitutionalists. Should they east their fortunes with the usurper whom they have been seeking to ove throw, they will involve their country in a new and graver problem. In any event, the United States is determined to face its responsibilities, whether they be small or great, and to bring the presen issue to a just and honorable conclusion. The cur rent week will probably end many uncertainties tha now exist and will indicate, in part at least, the riousness of the task ahead.

A Long Stride Forward For Atlanta's School System.

In commenting a month ago on the need for cer-tain changes in Atlanta's school methods, The Journal said: "Everyone who looks to the development of our public school system upon lines of higher efficiency and broader service will be interested in the program of readjustment, which Major Robert J. Guinn has submitted to the City Board of Education. Thoughtful parents as well as teachers have long felt that Atlanta's system of schools, though admirable in many respects, is at certain points rigid and artificial where it ought to be flexible and ademore naturally to human needs. They have felt that the normal child should be able to complete an ordi nary grammar school course in fewer than eight years, that more attention and more opportunities ment should be given the individual pupil, and that the advantages of high school training should be brought within the reach of a larger num ber of students."

It is peculiarly gratifying to know that the improvements, all of which were recommended in Major Guinn's resolutions, have been adopted by the Board of Education and will be inaugurated at the as The Journal said when they were first proposed. that our public school will not only be quit of many existing problems, such for instance as overcrowder class rooms, lost energy and lost time, but that it acquire new strength and usefulness, and will act more freely for the enrichment of individual and community life.

The most broadly interesting resolution is that which provides that the maximum number of pupils in each grammar school grade shall be forty and that the course of study in the grammar grades be tructed on a basis of seven instead of eight It is evident that forty pupils is the largest to whom one teacher can give personal, individual instruction; and this is the largest number consistent with health and discipline. It is clear, too, that when the efficiency of teaching is thus in-pressed, it will be altogather feasible to sever in

even years the course that consumes eight. Chil-Teachers will work more tellingly and under le perve strain. Parents will be relieved largely of the task of seeing to it that lessons are studied at hom for, there will be more time and means to prepare recitations in the class room. The fact is the eighti year in the grammar school is an unneces waste; it has been dropped in scores of progre cities, and its elimination here will mean tre economy.

This change will require of course a more elastic portunity for far-reaching improvements. Compa son of the total enrollment of Atlanta's public schools ildings show with the total capacity of the school bu that there would be room for all the pupils if they were properly distributed. Though some schools and some grades are badly congested, other schools and other grades are far from full. The overcrowding, it appears, is mainly in the lower grades, the younger children constituting a large majority of the pupils.

As the grades advance the proportionate enrollment decreases. Of the total number of children entering the schools only about five per cent con sighth grade, and in the high schools the total enrollment is only seven per cent of that in the grammar schools. By rearranging school districts, much room in the upper grades that is now wasted can be utilized, and the problem of space will be greatly simplified, if not entirely solved.

The resolution concerning the high schools pro vides for the adoption of the so-called "unit" system of studies to the end that students who are no planning to enter colleges or who who are not ablto take a full course looking to college entrance may be permitted to elect such studies as will be most useful in carrying forward their life plans

There are many boys who, upon finishing the grammar echool, find it impossible to take the high school course as it is now arranged. Their service is needed for the family's support. It often happens, however, that they can secure work which leaves a considerable part of their time unemployed, and they are ambitious to continue their education. It is unjust and unwise from a civic point of view, as The Journal has said before, that these young people ild be barred from high school advants ply because circumstances will not permit them to take a regular course. To meet these special needs, the Board of Education has instructed the school offcials "to work out a practical course of study, to gether with a schedule, for placing the high schools on the unit system-retaining in such course suffi nt units to meet college entrance requirements but reitering those pupils not planning to enter col-lege from taking the entire course, and at the same time providing a plan whereby they may fully complete such of the high school units as they desire.

Under this plan groups of studies designed for liege preparation will remain intect, open to all to wish to undertake them, but there will be other groups of studies available for students whose spare time is limited and who do not expect to enter college. This will extend the opportunities of high school education to scores of boys who are now de nied them. The curricula will be flexible adapted to individual needs; and the service of the schools will be wonderfully broadened.

The action of the Board in transferring the nor-

mal training department from the Girls' High School to one of the grammar schools, where the young women may acquire parotical experience along with their study of the theories of teaching, is so obviously sensible that it requires no comment. The readjustments in the grammar school and the high school courses are of utmost importance to the proress and usefulness of our public school system.
The Board of Education is to be congratulated upon its wise procedure, and Major Guinn, as author of the resolutions, merits the cordial thanks of the nunity


