Two New Battleships

The logic of events that urged Congress to speedy and favorable action on the army volunteer bill has proved equally effective for the needs of the navy. The House has provided for two new battleships This course was recommended months ago by the committee on naval affairs, but not until the Mex-ican crisis developed was its adoption assured. The timely work of the fleet at Vera Cruz has demon-strated the value of our naval forces and the im-portance of maintaining their strength and efficiency. One blow well struck has spared us many; and though it is the wish and hope of all good citizens that we have no war with Mexico or any other na-

tion, prudence impels us to be prepared.

Battleships, it has been well said, are cheaper than battles. This does not mean that the United States should plunge into extravagant measures and burden itself with great armaments like those that now crush the taxpayers of Europe. It does not mean that we should grow belligerent or renounce our ideals of peace. Yet, as Washington himself de clared. There is a rank due the United States among nations which will be withheld by a reputation of weakness. If we desire to avoid insult, we must be able to repel it." The development of the navy within reasonable limits is essential to the country's well-being; it is a matter of true economy. We have twenty-one thousand miles of seaconst to protect. We have more harbors with large cities

and a larger number of strategic points to safeguard than any other nation; we have Porto Rico, the Philippines, Hawaii and the Panama canal. As the dominant Power of this hemisphere, we have cer-

tain policies to uphold and certain responsibilities to bear; and the navy is our chief reliance.

For the sake of the nation's peace as well as its rights and welfare, Congress can well afford to deal liberally, though never extravagantly and never in a spirit of jingoism, with the naval program; and plan of two battleships a year, for the interfective future at least, seems reasonable.

Americans who are disposed to complain of the cost of their government should note the vast sums and towering rates in the new budget which the British parliament is asked to approve. The one item of income tax is broadly illustrative British income tax be broadly industrative. The British incomes above eight hundred dollars and upon the largest incomes amounts to approximately thirteen per cent. In the case of incomes of less than twenty-five hundred dollars, there is an allowance of fifty dollars for each child under sixteen years of age. The federal income tax in the United States ap-

plies only to incomes above four thousand dollars for married men and three thousand dollars for un narried men, and on incomes above five hundred housand dollars the tax is seven per cent, as compared with thirteen per cent in England.

Great Britain's expenditures for the navy and army are far greater than ours; and besides these and the cost of ordinary governmental machinery, enormous appropriations are made for old age ponsions and insurance against unemployment. The mar-vel is that Mr. Leloyd-George, chancellor of the exchequer, has been able to devise tax methods sufficient to secure the money. 


