Colonel Roosevelt's discovery of a great Brazilian river, hitherto unknown in geography, is a reminder that the earth still has its unpathod waters and undreamed shores. Boundless forests, holding, per-baps, the secret of buried civilizations, remain to

haps, the secret of buried civilizations, remain to be adventured. Vast regions at the top of the world are yet to be penetrated. Strange lands and strange peoples still stir the explorer's spirit. There was never, indeed, an age when the seat for discovery was keener, and cartainly none when it was so fincy tempered, with science. Not only the Arctic and Antarctic but the tropics as well, particularly the southern half of this hemisphere are engaging the interest of rarely talented men The expeditions of Peary and Scott and Amuneden and Stefannson and others in the polar regions are matched in South America by the Amason expedi-tion now being conducted by Dr. William C. Farabee under the patronage of the University of Pennsyivania

These explorers, we are told, are making the acquaintance of tribes "to whom white men are much a novelty as were Columbus and his followers to the natives who witnessed his discovery of a nev to the natives who witnessed his discovery of a new world for Castile and Leon. A dozen or more new tribes have been found and a number of rivers, pre-viously unknown, have been placed on the map. A writer in the Boston Transcript interestingly ob

Most of the watershed between the Guianas and Brazil has been absolutely unexplored country. So far as there is any record, white men have previously reached only one or two of the more accessible parts of it, and until now no scientific exploration has been attempted. Many photographs of the country and people are being photographs of the country and people are being taken, an aid to the popular understanding of the work accomplished that was not available for those formerly engaged in such enterprises, and new maps of the territory visited with ethnological charts and geographical outlines are being prepared. Fact is stranger than fiction, and the discoveries already made may rival Sir Conan Doyle's "Lost World."






