

The stockholders of a corporation engaged in manufacturing care noting about electing the engineers, the chemist or others whose duties are of a particular and often technical character. They realise that such places can be most satisfactorily filled through appointment; they know, indeed, that they themselves would not have the time or capacity to pass upon the merits of an engineer or a chemist; and so they very wisely loans such tasks to the managers of the business. we such tasks to the managers of the business.

Makers of every kind of road-building ma-chinery and material are planning exhibits. Experts on all phases of highway construction and mainte-nance are being secured for lectures, and hundreds of students are leoking eagerly forward to the op-portunities the Congress will afford. In its current issue the Manufacturers Record urged in its lending editorial that every State and

What has been the effect of road building on business, agricultural and social progress?
These and a thousand other questions of daily

concern to officials and to taxpayers will be asked and answered. Indeed, the Congress will be equival-ent to a university course in the all-important subject of good roads, and will richly repay every county that sends a representative and every delegate who

comes on his personal account.

Its quickening influence will be felt throughout the country, but especially in the South. The agricultural counties of this region have peculiar cause to be interested in the Congress. It is estimated that a Southwide system of good roads would save our farmers more than ave million dollars a year in the cost of hauling the cotton crop alone, while a national system of good roads would save more than national system of good roads would save more than ten millions a year in the wheat crop and nearly thirteen millions in the corn crop. The increase in land values that invariably follows highway develop-ment would knownt to millions annually, if our roads were put in firstelas's condition. And besides these material gains, every mile of improved roads will enrich the educational and social life of the

As an agricultural section, the South cannot afford As an agreement section, the south cannot anoru to neglect the highway problem, nor to leave unused any opportunity for extending and perfecting its good roads plans. The American Road Congress presents the greatest opportunity of the kind the Southern States have ever been offered. We are confident, too, that the progressive people of this territory will avail themselves of this rare advantage. Atlanta is easily accessible from every quarter of the South, and the railroads will offer inviting rates to the November convention. In the five States bor-dering Georgia there are nearly two hundred good reads organizations, and in Georgia slone there are fifty-three. Each of these organizations should be nty-times. Each of these organizations should be well represented at the American Road Congress, and in addition to them every State and every county in the entire South should send delegates.
