



There has passed in the death of General James P. Graves, a shiring exemplar of the knightly old South. He was a soldier of the type that fought beside Lee, a scholar who cherished learning as the flower of life, a gentleman whose courtiness was the outflow of a kindly heart, and whose conscience was his king.

General Graves served his home land through
the war of the Confederacy, and in the dark days
that ensued he gave his best to its rebuilding. He was the oldest surviving graduate of the University was the oldest surviving graduate of the University of Georgia. Uncommonly bleat in length of days, he passed the twilight of his four-and-ninety years in screne and sunbasken faith, faith in the essential goodness of mankind, in the worthiness of human life and the invisible Grace that guides the world.

Vital Statistics and Public Health. It is a significant fact that the health record of United States has steadily improved as the registration area for vital statistics has increased.

In 1880, when the registration area included only per cent of the population, the mortality rate was 8 per thousand.

In 1900, when the registration area had extended

to 37.5 per cent of the population, the mortality rate fell to 16.5 per thousand. In 1919 mortality had dropped 15 per thousand, the registration area having risen to 58.3 per cent.

In 1912, bureaus of vital statistics had been established in a majority of the States, and covered 63 per cent of the population; in the same year, inter-estingly enough, the death rate was only 13.9 per thousand, up to that time the lowest recorded.

The registration of vital statistics is unquestion-ably essential to effective campaigns against disease. These records of births and deaths and causes of death are aptly called, "life-and-death bookkeeping." Without them, the efforts of the medical profession and of health officials are seriously handicapped. Es of neath omeias are serously handicapped. Ex-cially is this true in the case of such maladies as phoid, malaria, peliagra and tuberculosis, which weem the community no less than the individual. Vital statistics point the way and gives impetus to

all manner of sanitary reforms. They place the health interests of county and State on a business basis, and naturally lead to wholesome results. That is why the mortality rate in the United States de-creased from nearly twenty per thousand to less than fourteen per thousand within the period when the registration increased from 17 per cent to 63 pe

nt of the population.

Georgia is said now to be the only State in all the Union that has not enacted a general vital statistics law. That is a disadvantage which the Legislature would make all possible haste to remove. The good ame and the deepest interests of the State are in-lived. Georgia must be put abreast the nation.






