Progress of Mediation.

The work of the Mexican peace conference moves steadily and hopefully forward. Says Justice La-mar, in summing the situation to date:

"We have begun to discuss the actual terms and details of a plan of pacification. On a number of them, we find ourselves in substantial agreement. Others are still under discussion, and as to them there has been no disagree.

This is very significant and encouraging. It means that in a week all the preliminaries of the mediation problem have been disposed of, and that the crucial issues involved are now being successfu by dealt with. Such conferences have frequently consumed many weeks in arriving at a ground of practical discussion. In this instance, there has been a straight, speedy thrust to the main questions There seems, indeed, to have been no quibbling on the part of anyone concerned. Everyone has been profoundly in earnest from the outset, and deter-mined to do everything consistent with reason and nonor to bring about a peaceful settlement of the

Mexican issue,

It is understood that the differences between
the United States and the Huerta regime have been
practically adjusted; that is to say, the demands of
the United States in this regard have been accepted. The delegates sent by Huerta realized in the begin The delegates sent of Huerta realized in the begin-ning that nothing short of the dictator's elimination from office would open the way to profitable dis-cussion of Mexico's broader problems and its future welfare. There have been no official announcements on this point, but it is commonly agreed that Huerta on this point, but it is commonly agree that further will retire, and that the remaining question of vital concern is the arrangement for a new provisional government and a declaration of principles on

agragnan reforms.

Until the land question is settled, there can be
no hope of efficient government and permanent
peace in Mexico. In this far-reaching issue, lie the
roots of all the revolutions that have torn and shaken that country. The Mexican people have not gonen that country. The avertean people have not going on fighting year after year, decade after decade, merely for the love of turmoil. They have sometimes been missied by selfish adventurers, to be sure, and had they been a stronger and more thoughtful people, in the mass, they might have settled their problems through an orderly process.
But the fact remains that until the land is opened
to individual rights and enterprise, Mexico will continue in civil war, and will be a constant problem

President Wilson wishes, therefore, that some as surance of aquarian reforms be vouchsafed through the present mediation conference; and the South American governments that have undertaken to bring peace about are in thorough accord with this

The fact that the Constitutionalists have not yet become a party to the mediation conference is not discouraging. There is good reason to believe that at the decisive moment, they will, enter the council and will do their part toward establishing a responrnment through orderly means

The Home Rule Bill.

Now that the Irish Home Rule bill has passed th House of Commons at three successive sea House of Commons at three successive sessions, it is virtually a law, and the crisis of this long vexed issue is at hand. What will be the outcome? Will Ulster plunge forward in its threat of armed rebellion, or will cool counsel prevail, and civil strife be averted? In the British character there is a certain balance and restraint, a genius of common sense and orderly government, which make war in that ancient kingdom seem almost impossible. Nowhere has the rit of revolution been busier in recent dece spirit of revolution been busier in recent decades than in the British lates, nowhere have political and social changes gone more steadily onward, but it has been a revolution in thought not in blood, and the changes, profound as they are, have left the rosts of government undisturbed. There is reason, then, to believe that the shock of the present situation will be followed by prompt recovery; and that despite its difficulties and dangers the problem will work out in peace.

The Ulster Protestants de clare that theirs is the richest and thriftiest prov ince of the land, and that they should not be taxed to support a government controlled by provinces which are poorer and less progressive and by men of a contrary religious faith. To this, the Home Rule advocates reply that the welfare, and freedom of Ireland as a whole count for more than the wishes of any one locality, that the country's com or any one locality, that the country's common in-terests are above particular interests, and that the will of the many should not be sacrificed to the scruples of a few.

It should be remembered in this c Ireland has been striving for Home Rule more than a hundred years. Outside Ulster, the people are de-yoted to this cause as to a sacred tradition, for which their fathers suffered and fought and on which some of the most heroic chapters in all history have been written. If religious sentiment against Home Rule is strong in Utster, patriotic sentiment for Home Rule is even stronger throughout the other provinces. However keen may be one's sympathy with the feeling of the Ulstermen, the long pathy with the reeling of the Ustermen, the long cherished and earnest convictions of the great ma-jority of the Irish people cannot be disregarded. The bill which passed the House of Commons on

Monday and which will become a law despite reject tion by the Lords, provides for the establishment of an Irish parliament to administer purely Irish affairs. This parliament will have no power to legislate on peace or war, coinage, legal tender, foreign relatipeace or war, coinage, tegan tenter, toterage relations or trade outside of Ireland. Its functions will be parallel to those of a State legislature in this coun-try; all matters of Imperial concern will still be dealt with at Westminster. It is expressly provided, too, that the Irish parliament shall make no laws either directly or indirectly, "to establish or endo any religion, or prohibit the free exercise thereof, or give a preference privilege or advantage or impose any disability or disadvantage on account of religious belief or religious or ecclesiastical status, or

ious belief or religious or eccessastical status, or make any religious belief or religious ceremony a condition of the validity of any marriage." It is evident from the clause just quoted that the makers of the law have been at particular pains to prevent anything like an entanglement of church and government in the new Irish system. They is and government in the new frish system. They in-sist that the religious liberties of Ulster will be as secure under Home Rule as they are today; and they predict that in time Ulster itself will realize the political justice and the ecenomic advantages of Rome Rule and will gradually come to appre

of nome kine and will gradually come to approve the plan which it now defies.

Premier Asquith has proposed, moreover, that all the counties of Ulster choose by popular vota whether they shall become a part of the new irish government or remain outside its jurisdiction, ou their present status, for a period of six years. The six-year interim, he argues, will afford an ample-test of the working of the Irish parliament and will also give time for sober reflection on the part of all concerned. He believes, too, that this period will allay most of the fear in regard to religious rights and will convince the now disaffected minority of and will convince the now disaffected minority of the wisdom of joining with the rank and file of their countrymen in a free administration of home affairs
