The Senator's complaint is interesting chiefly for the reason that it indicates that the South is at last coming into its own as regards the service and the appropriations of the federal government. Under any just and reasonable apportionment of funds for agricultural research and development, the South would naturally receive the most important share, because it is by far the most important agricultural

Georgia will profit largely by this appropriation bill because her wide range of climate and elevation and her variety of soils make her a possible pro ducer of nearly all crops. Immensity of the Postal Service.

Postmaster General Burleson says that in a period of fourteen months he has appointed twenty-three thousand, three hundred and seventeen postmasters.
"But," he adds, "that is not one-half of the great army of postmasters." The number of postoffices in the United States exceeds fifty-seven thousand, and all the persons in their employ would reach far into the hundred-thousands

It is doubtful, indeed, that there is any other in stitution in the world, certainly none of its kind. stitution in the world, certainly none of its kind, which is comparable to the United States postoffice in the magnitude of its service. The revenue of the department last year amounted to two hundred and sixty-six million, six hundred and nineteen thousand, five hundred and twenty-five dollars, while that of the British department, as the Louisville Courier Journal points out, is estimated at only one hundred and five millions for the current year. The postoffices, telegraphs and telephones combined yielded the French government only eighty million dollars last year, and Germany's income from those three branches of service was less than two hundred mil-

ons.

The immensity of the United States postoffice makes it especially important that its affairs be ad-ministered with the utmost possible efficiency and with an eye single to the public good. It is a well-recognized fact that this has been the controlling policy of the present administration. Mr. Burleson undertook a tremendous task. Under shameful regime of his predecessor, the department had be-come a machine for sordid politics and persecution. False economics had crippled the service without really reducing deficit. Not only have these evils been uprooted, but many positive improvements have been made. The postal service again commands the public's confidence, and is steadily growing in public




