Atlanta will never rise higher than its public schools, for, they are the training camp of the rank and file of the men and women who are to make the city whatever it becomes. The development of the public schools, therefore, means the upbuilding and the progress of this community. The changes which the Board of Education have planned and are to inaugrate at the beginning of the next scholastic term will usher in a new erk of ducational service and growth. They will place our grammar schools and high schools They will place our grammar schools and high schools abreast the highest standards in the country. The will open new opportunities for the children and the ers, and will effect great economics in energy

It is peculiarly gratifying to note that the working out of this program has had the hearty co-operation of every member of the Board of Education, and that it is assured the cordial support of the Superintenden and all the teachers. The people of Atlanta should rnize the excellent work that has been done and is being done in their behalf, and should uphold in every possible way the forward movement that has been undertaken

Where Georgia Comes In.

The agricultural appropriation bill, which has passed the House and has been favorably reported in the Senate, provides for the expenditure of some fitteen million dollars. Of this fund, the share al-lotted to the South and to Georgia is especially liberal. It is estimated that Georgia's farming interests will benefit to the extent of a million dollars through the experiment and demonstration work that will be conducted in this State. For these advantages, we are indebted to the con-structive program of the Democratic administration,

which has emphasized from the outset the impor tance of rural needs. It is notoworthy, too, that Georgia is represented on the agriculture committee in both branches of Congress—in the Senate by Sen-ator Hoke Smith, and in the House by Congressman Gordon Lee. Each of them has been constantly steri to the interests of the State, and though asking the interests of the State, and though asking no ore than was due, they have seen to it that the ate's rights were fully recognized.

Furthermore, Georgia's wide range of climate

and elevation makes her a potential producer of practically all the crops that are grown in this country. She has nine distinct zones of temperature, v. She has nine distinct zones of temperature, wonderful variety of soils. She can raise oranges in the south and apples in the north. Corn oranges in the south and appear in the north. Corn and wheat as well as cotton will flourish on her acres, and her natural opportunities for animal hus-bandry are scarcely excelled in the entire Union. And so it happens that to whatever province of as riculture the federal government turns its attention, Georgia looms up as a profitable field for research and experiment.

In addition to the funds provided in the agricul tural appropriation bill, this State will share also in those of the Smith-Lever agricultural extension law, under which ten thousand dollars a year is given each State unconditionally for farm demonstration work; and if our Legislature meets the national government half way, twenty-five thousand dollars more for the same purpose can be secured. This money means education: it means fresh opportunit and enterprise; it means new thought and energy for the development of Georgia's vast stores of natural treasure and for the enrichment of he

The President Is Right.

P RESIDENT WILSON wisely urges that the trust

question be disposed of at the present session of Congress. Nothing, as he says, is more dangerous to business than uncertainty. So long as this issue is in suspense, industry and commerce will remain hesitant: so soon as it is settled upon lines of justice and moderation, they will move confidently forward. Trust legislation there must be sooner or later: the party's pledge must be redeemed, the country's conscience must be satisfied, the abuses of monopoly must be broken, and the rights of all honest enterprise vouchsafed. These duties are to be performed, not as an attack upon business interests, but as a service to business welfare and free dom; and, far from discouraging activity, they will hearten and assure every field of our econemic life. Why, then, defer this wholesome and constructive

Why hang back from doing what everyone work? knows must be done and will be done? Why not end the uncertainty now? Why not, as the President has expressed it, "do the thing moderately and soberly now, instead of waiting until more radical forces have accumulated and it is neces-sary to go much further?"

If a revolutionary or radical program of trust legis-

ation were proposed, it would be necessary to may slowly; but just the contrary is true. The spirit and purpose of the pending bills were well described in the President's message last January when he said:

"Fortunately, no measures of sweeping or novel change are needed. It will be understood that our object is not to unsettle business, or anywhere seriously to break its established courses athwart. On the contrary, we desire the laws we are now about to pass to be bulwarks and safeguards of industry against the warms and sateguards or naustry against the forces that have disturbed it. . What must every candid man say of the suggestions I have laid before you, of the plain obligations of which have reminded you? That these are new things for which the country is not prepared? things for which the country is not prepared? No; but that they are old things, now familiar, and must of course be undertaken, if we are to square our laws with the thought and desire of the country. Until these things are done, conscientious business men will be unsatisfied.

And until they are done, business movements will remain hampered and uncertain. Peace and pros-perity are not assured by putting off those questions that perplex and disturb a nation, but by meeting them squarely and settling them promptly. Every one agrees that the setlement of the tariff issue was distinctly helpful to business; even those manufacturers who opposed certain schedules in the revision ion are glad that the discussion is ended, and would not now reopen it. The settlement of the banking and currency issue brought instant improvement in business conditions, and the new system was accepted by the entire country as a guarantee of better

In like manner the settlement of the trust ques In like manner the sectioner of the trust ques-tion will be followed by a feeling of relief and se-curity. When business knows just what to expect, to what standards of law and government it must con-form, the lines of readjustment will be complete, and the era of new freedom and certitude will be fully nahered in.

The pending trust bills, as we have said are no revolutionary; rather, they are designed to clarify the existing law and to solve certain problems that have long been a source of agitation. If Congress especially the Democrats in Congress, itself to this task with due energy and in the proper spirit, the bills can be enacted within the next thirtj or forty days, and the country will enjoy genuine repose. Business will know precisely what are its duties, its opportunities; and the coming autumn will deepen upon a nation free from doubt and tranquilly bent upon its harvest task.

If, on the other hand, the trust question is car ried over until next winter, there will be continued uncertainty and, perhaps, growing unrest. The win-ter session will be crowded with other matters of deep importance. A rural credits bill must then be enacted, and a number of measures in the adminis-tration's program for conserving and developing the country's natural resources must be dealt with. There will be less time and opportunity to put through the trust legislation next winter than there is today, when the decks have been cleared for this one, all-important duty. Present delay, therefore, would mean future delay. It would mean that business interests would be kept in prolonged, if not in definite suspense.

The President states a fact when he says there is material or substantial reason why the business of the country should not be in the most prosperous and expanding condition. There is promise of a crop more bounteous than America has ever known.

There is the immediate guarantee of the new banking and currency system under which financial panic will be virtually impossible. There is the prespect of an early, and it is believed, a favorable decision from the Interstate Commerce Commission on the railroads' appeal for an advance in freight rates. The surces and conditions of prosperity anderlying a

The fact is, this country today is not to be liken ed to a patient recovering from drastic surgery and dreading a new operation, but rather to a strong man who is bent upon a fruitful journey, and whose set-ting forth waits only upon a clear outline of the path he is to follow. Let Congress end this uncertainty by enacting the trust bills at the present set sion, and business will move forward.

From Cincinnati, comes tidings of a great dis very—a locometive which doesn't smoke within the city limits, or which, if it smokes at all, does so with due regard to the public's comfort and health.

Officials say that the device adopted for this purpose works steadily and well, and affords a remedy for one of the direct nuisances American cities suffer

The Times-Star ramarks in this connection that "after the great floods of last year, when most of the local railroads were out of commission, Cincin natis atmosphere became clear as if by magle" and that if the faith of those who have observed the new appliance is justified, "where will be enough force in public opinion to compel its general adoption."

in it is that the smoke trouble in mos cities lies largely in the railroads. Atlanta's smoke inspector declares in his annual report that the locomotive is the most difficult puroblem to handle motive is the most diment purchase to handle, from both the engineering and the official standpoint. "Nobody," he says, "has yet developed any equip-ment that will satisfactorily control the smoke from all classes of locomotive and under all operating conditions. Consequently the only way to determine the efficiency of any such device is to try it, and that is a tedious and expensive process. The official handicap lies in the traditional reductance of rallroads to submit to any form of statutory regulation that they consider inconvenient, and in the impractidability of dealing directly and conclusively with any one official of a railroad."

It cannot be doubted, however, that persistent campaigning will eventually bring results in this as in other spheres of the smoke problem. Some years ago it was hotly denied that any form of smoke regulation was practicable, yet we find a number of regulation was practicable, yet we find a number of cities that have reduced smoke to a negligible amount so far as stationary plants are concerned; and there de though unfortunately rare, that hav made substantial progress in this reform





ALTIMORE.—The old Biadensburg duelling ground is soon to be bonverted into building lots for happy homes, and the shouts of childhood will soon secto where once the murderous pistol barked, the sword clashed, the dy-

The famous duelling ground borders a small brook and is about fifteen acres in extent, flat and low and covered with weeds, grass, vines and as occasional cedar. It was convenient to Washington, close enough to Bladensbürg for a night; lodging and easy of escape from legal authority on either side of the

More than fifty hostile meetings occurred on the banks of this lonely and melancholy brook—some fatal, some bloodless. The first victim was Edward Hopkins, of Maryland an ensign of infantry. He fell early in

Two duels were fought on the ground that were especially desperate. One was between General Mason, senator from Virginia, and Colo

Although they were cousins, they had a violent tilt at the polls in Leesburg. Va. Mason challenged McCarty's vote and McCarty at once challenged Mason's life. Mason at first declined, was called a coward, and then determined to die, if need be, to retute the charge.

Neither would collect to terms in which there was the least escape from death for the other. 


