Kentucky Sets an Example.

It is a trite observation to make that free gov-rnment and good government are predicated upon the education and enlightenment of its citizens. For a citizen to participate adequately and beneficially in self-government, he must possess a wide and sure knowledge of men and measures that he can acquire only imperfectly except through his ability to read and write

While this truth is obvious, it' needs to stressed often and with all the vehemence that language can convey, for the high percentage of lilliterarcy in this and other southern states gives this section an unenviable eminence and acts as a bar to the realization of its fullest develo

The public school system cannot reach adult illiteracy. In that case it has failed of its purpose until too late. •


