





The fact that the public temper and the officia olicy of the United States are opposed to the maintenance of a great standing army makes it the more important that this nation develop an efficient mil itary reserve. We do not need and will not have burdenseme war machine, but we do need and ought to support, in addition to the regular army, a body of citizen soldiers trained for the needs of national President Wilson stated the case con incingly, when he said in his latest message to

orientally, when he sald in his latest message to constress:

"It will be right enough, right American policy, based upon our accustomed pupplejoes and practices, 40 provide a system by which every citizes who will volunteer for the training may be made familiar with the use of modern arms, the rudiments of drill and maneuver, and the maintenance and sanitation of camps. We should recourage such training and make it as means of discipline which our young men will leafn to value. It is right that we should provide it not only, but that we should make it as attractive as possible. . . And in outline, at least, these plans and methods are fairly clear. One obvious means of developing reserve strength for our small standing army is to encourag and upbuild the National Guard. Brigadier General
A. L. Mills, chief of the War Department's division
of militia affairs, says that in no State is the preribed minimum peace strength of all organization of the National Guard maintained, and that in many to the various Guart management, and that it many instances the deficiency has reached such a degree as to leave the corresponding organization of no value as a military asset to the nation. A remedy for this serious condition, thinks General Mills, lies in the enactment of a measure by Congress, providing rea-sonable compensation for members of the National Guard. The suggestion is wise. Service in the mi-litia as it is now organized demands sacrifices of title as it is now organized demands sacrifices of time and, in some cases, of money. This cost dis-courages hundreds of young men from entering or remaining in the National Guard. The Government could well afford to commensate them for hours of ac-tual service, when by so doing it would enlarge and perfect so important a branch of the nation's mil By all means, Congress should pass a bil

Another practical and thoroughly acceptable means Another practical and thoroughly acceptable means of compassing the needs in view would be the use of the standing army as a school for comparatively short terms of military training. Secretary Garri-son, of the War Department, asas in this connection that "by intensive military training, any young man of good health and average mentality can be made a servicable soldier in twelve months, " "This has been tried abroad, and I have caused it to be tried under my own administration and inspection. Even if there were doubt about it, it would not cause a different conclusion to be reached by a reasonable man, because we certainly would be better off with a reserve of men who had one year's training than we are without any reserve at all, and having to depend, as we do, upon men who have never had any train-ing whatever." If the term of enlistment were thus shortened, the army would be open as a means of education, well worth while, to thousands of young men. And, as Secretary Garrison points out, besides the military training it would offer, this plan presents other distinct advantages. "Inquiry among those who have employed men discharged with good records from the army shows," he says, "that they esteem as among their best employes; and there is no doubt that any community would be economic benefited by the presence in it of young men who have learned in the only school which really teaches that is, experience-the qualities of self-control, obs dience to discipline, and determination to carry e task which has been set for one."

Still another means of building up a defensive re-

serve is to be found in these schools and colleg whose curricula include military trai

such institutions are already of pronounced value in this respect, but with due co-operation from the in this respect, but with due co-operation from the Government they would become more broadly and more definitely useful. The War Department in-augurated some seasons ago the so-called student military camps where numbers of college boys are given wholesome experience and instruction during a part of their vacation period. The idea behind that plan might well be extended and applied in other directions. The military schools and colleges should be made available to larger groups of young men By just what methods this should be done—whether through a system of scholarships, or special grants or otherwise—ls a matter for careful consideration; but the principle itself is well worth testing.

A Gap That Must Be Filled.

A particularly impressive statement of the need of increased meat production is found in the annual report of the federal Department of Agriculture. During the census decade ending 1909, it appears, the number of cattle in the United States fell from fifty million to forty-one million, the number of sheep from sixty-one million to fifty-two million, and the number of hogs from sixty-three million to fifty-eight million. The tendency continues downward, distressingly so; and yet, as the report observes, the country's population has increased more than twenty million during the period since 1899. By some means, this growing gap between food demand and food supply must be filled.

"It is evident," the department officials eay,
"that we have been considering the meat supply
of the Nation too exclusively in terms of the
ligranch and of beef antimals. Obviously it is
important that we continue to help the cattlemen and to sisselt in further developing the big

Georgia has great tracts of land, now idle and comparatively cheap, which could be used profitably as ranches; but more important than this are the opportunity and the need for each farm in the State to raise enough live stock to sup-ply its own demands. By so doing, our farmers will advance their own interests and at the same time open a way for the larger development of one of the open a way for the larger development of one of the richest fields in agricultural economy: Whether or not it be true as an investigator recently said, that the average farm in Georgia produces less than two eggs a week, for each member of the family, less than two-thirds of an ounce of butter and two-thirds of a pint of milk a day, one-third of a hog, one-twelfth of a beef and one one-hundredth of a sheep a year, it is certain that we fall far short of supplying our home needs in this regard and that the preseeds from our cotton crop have not sufficed to pay for the foodstuffs we import from distant regions. No Southern State, the Department of Agriculture declares, is giving due attention to the production of

foodstuffs and live stock. It is noted in this conne to and the suck. It is noted in this connection that reas buys annually from other States more than fifty million dollars' worth of wheat, corn and oats, Georgia more than twenty-four millions, South Carolina more than twenty millions; and that twelve Southern States import each year more than one hundred and seventy-five million dollars' worth of number and seventy-live inition dollars works of meet, dairy and poultry products. "It may be ad-mitted," the Department of Agriculture comments, "that most of these States should not undertake the production of these commodities for foreign or inter state shipment in competition with the States of the Middle West, but every student of the subject must recognize the unwisdom of neglecting to produce enough of these things for the consumption of their own people and for laying the foundation of a prorous live stock development."

It is shown further that the value of orchard fruits now exceeds one bundred and forty million dollars annually, and that the value of vegetables is little less than half a bil-lion dollars a year. The production of hay and forage, the report adds, approximates one hundred million tone, valued at more than eight hundred mil-lion dollars, and "the poultry products of the nation have reached a point where their annual value is about one-half that of the cotton crop."

Wherever the methods of agriculture are modern and efficient, wherever the profits of agricul-ture are mounting, there is a strong tendency to di-versity and to produce both an abaundance and a variety of fooderups. Our State's production of potatoes, peas and other vegeta-bles, of orchard fruits and nuts, of poultry and pigs and other table supplies has grown steadily in the last few years. This was to prove the efficiency Cards wer. provided to show the attendance, weight, and general physical condition of the children, and, since school began, those cards have been filled out once onts at the bestiming and at the end of the year. The following questions were asked when children entered the open-air class:

In buildings such as our main building where our indoor classes are taught, the heated air that is forced into the rooms by fans may or may not be pure. When the fans are running the air can be kept in circuitation; but when the fans are not running, it is impossible to ventilate properly.
