

The South's Oil Resources.

As an example of the range and variety of South-ern resources, the New Orleans Times-Picayune notes the fact that five States of this section, Kentucky, Louisiana, Oklahoma, Texas and West Vir cinis, furnish, in value of output, approximately one-balf of the petroleum produced in the United States. "It is only a question of time and a very short time at that" this newspaper observes, "when the country and the world will largely depend on these five Southern States for petroleum which has become so important that an abundance or shortage in its supply is seriously influencing the war conditions in

"The oil industry in the South is comparatively new. A Wise Postponement Of the Bond Question.

Council has done wisely in deferring action or the proposed bond issue. Under the financial condi-tions which now prevail, the marketing of three million deliars worth of municipal bonds would be a very grave and difficult venture; and in the public's present frame of mind, the chances of a bond issuat the polls would be extremely doubtful. It therefore fortunate for all the interests involved that Council has moved cautiously in this matter; its successors in office will do well to imitate the ex-

True there is undeniable need of improvemen True there is undestable need of improvement and expansion in several departments of the city's affairs, especially in that of schools, and those needs should be met as soon and as liberally as circumstances allow. But a bond issue undertaken at the wrong time and destined to failure would not at the wrong time and destined to railire would not solve these problems; it would merely complicate them and make real relief more difficult to obtain. It will be far better to await favorable conditions, even though the interim has its hardships, than to hazard the defeat of bonds in the election, or the sale of them on disadvantageous terms.

the market for all manner of securities has been depressed by the war in Europe. It is only within the last few weeks that the New York stock exchange has resumed operation, and it has been compelled as a matter of safety to adopt minimum price levels. Is it probable that under these conditions city bonds could be disposed of on a satisfactory basis? Rather, to is likely that Atlanta would have to sell its securities below par, if at all, with a consequent loss of, perhaps, a quarter of a million dollars. It would be possible, of course, to specify that the bends should possible, of course, to specify that the body should not be sold below a certain figure but if that price could not be obtained the whole plan would crumble; and the city would be far worse off than now.

The Journal heartily favors every feasible plan to uphuild the school system or to accomplish other needed improvements. But the vital importance of these interests themselves should deter the city from embarking them upon stormy and uncertain wakers. The present Council has shown good sense and foresight in postponing the bond question. The incoming Council should be equally prudent.

The Extraordinary

Demand for Horses.

If Europe's extraordinary demand for American horses and mules continues, it may become necessary to adopt unusual measures to protect our own needs. France recently placed in the United States an order for one bundred and fifty thousand horses, and that is but one among many such deals already effected or in prospect. In the event of a prolonged war, these ourchases will reach far into the millions, with the result of serious handicans to farming and other

pursuits in this country.

Despite the wonderful increase in the use of motor vehicles, the industrial value of the horse has in no wise lessened. On the contrary, the demand for horse has advanced steadily during the very period that has witnessed the development of the automobile. In 1900, according to the federal census, there were twenty-one million, two hundred and three thousand, nine hundred and one horses in the United States, with an aggregate value of one billion, fifty million, five hundred and twenty-six thousand dollars; In 1910, the number was something less than twenty million and the aggregate in excess of two billion; and within that decade the average price of the horse more than doubled.

There were divers predictions not many year ago that horses and mules would become obsolete, most of their tasks being taken over by the gasoline engine. And as a matter of fact, the automobile and kindred machines are now doing much of the work for which horses were once indispensable, and are doing it more economically. For that very circum stance, however, it is the more interesting and significant that the demand for horses has incre continually and their value grown more and mor


