If Pan-American effort can induce the belligerent ations of Europe to withdraw their warships from the neutral waters of this hemisphere, much will be the neutral waters of this hemisphere, much will be accomplished for commerce and peaceful relation-ships. The trade of the Americas has undoubtedly suffered in consequence of hostile European facets unking to strike at each other. Hundreds of German steamers are lying idle in South American ports and British merchantmen are intimidated in South

there is danger of misunderstandings, if not serious entanglements, over the use of wireless and over coaling privileges. The South American countries ger to avoid all such complications with Eu ropean governments, and they are very eager to re-move the obstacles and discouragements to their

The Polar Mirage.

"What a region it is, that intangible reaim that stretches northward into nothingness and mere oblivion! A region of unearthly lights, of mysterious noises, of elusive natives, of treacherous waters, of never-never lands. Is it any wonder that travelers from that bourne bring contradictions and tales that stagger the imagination?" This comment is inspired by the report of the Crocker Land expedition of the American Museum of Natural History that Crocker Land is not really a place but an optical illusion Donald B. McMillan, leader of the exploring party declares that what at first appeared a vast island or promontory proved to be, upon nearer approach and

longer observation, merely a mirage.

Interest in this latest word from the far North is heightened by the fact that Admiral Feary in 1906 discovered Crocker Land, or thought he discovered it, and gave it the name it has borne. If he was mistaken in Crocker Land was he mistaken also in the Pole? Certainly, the representations of the more ecent explorers give rise to bewilderment and doub oncerning a vast deal of Arctic lore. One writer re marks, rather waggishly, that it is too bad to go through the perli and hardship of piercing the polar regions, only to have the most reliable evidences of the exploit whisk themselves out of sight and leave the explorer without support for the truth or accuracy of his narrative. "Now that doubt is cast upon the achievements of Peary, because of the nonexistence of a polar continent which he saw with mortal eyes, men will ask: How will he know that he reached the Pole, if he did not know a continent when he saw it? The evidence of the visit to the Pole is the same evidence that established the existence of Crocker Land; and now Crocker Land has joined the insubstantial pageant of dreams."




