

Far from being a handicap, the war ha ved really an advantage to musical interests in the United States. The enforced cancelling of many ents on the Continent has brought a num ber of gifted artists to America. Virtually the en tire cast of the Metropolitan company reached h York in safety several months ago. A few of the men who rank among the stars are on the fighting line, but the great majority of all the singers have known are in this country, and have been aug ented by many distinguished newe

The improvement already manifest in business conditions, and the great revival of prosperity augured for 1915 leave no doubt as to the practica wisdom of making ready for another opera week in Atlanta next spring. Popular sentiment on this mat ter has been thoroughly sounded by the Music Fes fival Association, with the result of an emphatic and widespread avowal that the people want opera and

#### How Best to Encourage Food Crops in Georgia.

A Journal correspondent writes that the Moul-trie, Ga., packing house is receiving many shipments of hogs, one such transaction having amounted to seventeen hundred dollars. This accessible market enables the farmers of the surrounding country to get money at a time of particular need, and encourages them to keeper interest in animal huscourages them to seemer interest in animal nu-bandry and diversified crops. Furthermore, it de-velops new business for the community and is a profitable investment for its owners.

All these benefits are to be derived from packing

houses and other institutions for marketing Georgia flood products. They must be established, of cou at logical points and must be conducted upon so principles of business; but such risks as may be volved are trivial beside the opportunities which are offered and the urgent needs to be filled. Men of means and enterprise can undertake no timelies work for their town and county than that of providing market facilities for home grown foodstuffs

sands of acres heretofore given over to co will be devoted next year to grain, hay, live stock, potatoes, peas and other such staples. mers realize that another large or as tarmers reasize that another large or even order ary output of cotton in 1915 would be rulinous, and hey are turning to food crops as their one hope of olving present problems and escaping future perils That is a wise policy, but if it is to yield due re suits it must be followed by adequate means for con verting food crops into cash. The farmer must be enabled to dispose of his surplus corn, wheat, hay. oats, meat and other commodities as easily as in the past he has disposed of his cotton

e reason why foodstuffs have not been raised extensively in Georgia is that there has been no ready and ample market for them. We have in ported billions of dollars worth of such products from distant States, but we have offered scant in-ducement to their production at home. We have made it very easy to market cotton, but extremely difficult to market foodstuffs. The farmer has been able to bring his load of raw cotton to town, place and to bring his load of raw cotton to town, place it in a warehouse and, with the warehouse receipt, get money or credit without more ado. But if he had a load of corn or wheat, he could not dispose of

It by any such simple process. The chances have been, indeed, that he could not dispose of it at all. True, this condition has been no valid reason why farmers should not produce enough food supplies to meet their own needs. In no wise can i Georgia has produced for each member of its family less than two eggs a week, less than two-thirds of an ounce of butter, and two-thirds of a pint of milk a day, and only one-third of a hog and one-twelfth of a beef a year. There are, to be sure, scores and hundreds of competent farmers to whom this record does not apply; but when the average is taken, the figures reported by the national Department of Agr culture, cannot well be challenged. Regardless of markets, every Georgia farm should produce at least enough bread and meat to make it independent in these necessaries of life.

But if this State is to enjoy the pr which its natural resources entitle it, it must gg further and give food crops a major place in its sys tem of agriculture. The fact that our cotton lacks millions of dollars of paying our yearly food bil makes it imperative that we break away, once and for all, from the one-crop plan; and especially is this true at a time when the world war is creating an unprecedented demand and correspondingly high prices for American foodstuffs.

The tyranny of cotton cannot be broken, however and diversified farming cannot prosper as it should unless there are means for marketing food crops means as ample in their way as those for marketing cotton have been. There must be warehouses for grain and hay, and packing houses for beef pork. There must be well established connect between those who want to produce and those want to buy Georgia food products,

The Moultrie packing is an example of how serviceable such an enterprise can be, of its great value to the farmer, the community and to the individual interests behind it. In every part of Georgia, public pirited business men should study local needs in


